



A stirring testament to the resilience of the human spirit and the transformative power of music, Violins of Hope recounts the extraordinary journeys of violins played by Jewish musicians during the Holocaust and of the Israeli violinmaker devoted to restoring these cherished instruments. Each instrument holds a uniquely compelling and poignant story, interwoven with one man's deeply personal struggle to reconcile his own family's past with the larger history of his people. Profoundly moving and deeply insightful, this book illuminates the legacy of the Holocaust through the lens of music and memory.
