SONNETS AND STANZAS, FREE VERSE AND RHYME— April is National Poetry Month

Poetry can bring color to an otherwise ordinary observation. Celebrate and explore poetry at the library this month. Discover new poets through our collection. Subscribe to The Beat, our podcast featuring regional poets reading their work. Attend a reading or program. Or, you might challenge yourself to write a daily haiku.

This month at our All Over the Page book discussion, poet Maurice Manning will read poems from his book, Bucolics, followed by a Q&A session and banjo picking. The program will be recorded live and released as an episode of The Beat. Join us in the third floor classroom of Lawson McGhee Library on Monday, April 10 at 6:30 pm to enjoy this special session.



Join Pulitzer Prize-finalist Maurice Manning at this month's All Over the Page book discussion for poetry readings, banjo picking, and a live recording of The Beat podcast.

Maurice Manning's first book of poems, Lawrence Booth's Book of Visions (2001), was selected by W.S. Merwin for the Yale Series of Younger Poets Award. His book, The Common Man (2010), was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in poetry.

The Beat: A Poetry Podcast

In each show, produced by the Library's Alan May and Melissa Brenneman, Alan introduces a new poet, then listeners get to hear poems being read by the author themselves. While David Orr describes the idea some of us have about reading poetry



as "solving a calculus problem while being zapped with a cattle prod," Alan's show is painless.
